Wisconsin Farm Technology Days

During July 21-23 Wisconsin FTD's welcomed over 80,000 visitors despite some soggy conditions on Tuesday and a delayed start on Wednesday. Those attending had good things to say about the annual show that featured some of the latest innovations in agriculture among its 700 different exhibits.

One of the biggest draws to the Waterloo, WI show was a \$4 million manure digester, owned by Clear Horizons, a Milwaukee company that

develops biogas energy systems. It's estimated that 5,000 people toured the digester operation, which makes electricity from the waste of the Crave Brothers' 2,000 cows. The unit produces enough energy to heat the farm's office, machine shed, hospital pens, special-needs barn, and pasteurizing area with any excess being sold to the power company.

Drawing a big crowd into the WCA Beef Tent was opening day speaker, WGN radio and RFD - TV personality, Orion Samuelson (see photo above of Vic Eggleston visiting with Orion). Moving through the tent, he also stopped and talked "beef" with each of the 13 people displaying their beef breed. Represented were Highlander, Polled Hereford, Pinzgauer, Normande, Simmental, Angus, Buelingo, American British White Park, Shorthorn, Piedmontese, South Devon, Texas Longhorn, and the Belted Galloway.

In the Belted Galloway pen was Arbor Winds Farm Belle owned by Al & Cathy Stern. Belle arrived clipped, scrubbed, and fluffy as could be. For 3 days she stood for hundreds of head pats and didn't even flinch at all the pint sized kids who rushed up to her pen. Balloons, plastic bags and yardsticks presented no problem. With so many visitors now carrying a digital camera or cell phone, picture taking was at an all time high....no problem there either. When tired of the attention, she moved to the back of the pen to rest.

To her credit, Belle is a Camp Hope graduate. Cathy and Belle attended this recent Belted Galloway event in Joliet, IL and Cathy successfully implemented the lessons. She even paid grandchildren \$1 each to replicate FTD's conditions while Belle was safely tied in their barn. Kathi Jurkowski (IL), a special visitor to the Beef Tent, gave the promotion a "thumbs up."

The Waterloo location was one of the best for crowd interaction in recent years. People traffic was continual; interest in learning about the breed was high. We learned there are a lot of belted cattle throughout this country. Most are not registered; some are probably not Belted Galloway, but because of the belt and size owners believe they are. Producers like their fit for individual feeding programs, no two of which seem to be the same. The *Belties 2009* was distributed and is now in many homes and offices in Wisconsin, Illinois, and Iowa.

FTD's 2010 is scheduled for July 20-22 in Pierce County, River Falls, WI. Belted Galloway breeders from that area have already volunteered to be your breed representatives.

In Memoriam

We sadly report that Dick Frey of Glenwood City, Wisconsin succumbed to a malignant brain tumor August 1, 2009.

After a long and distinguished career in firefighting, Dick established the Great Lakes region's first herd of Belted Galloways in the early 1980s and remained a dedicated supporter of the breed until the end of his life. Dick and Pat Frey's Fun-E Farm generally carried 60 to 100 animals, providing foundation stock to many Midwestern start-up herds, and he was among the earliest to raise steers to promote Beltie beef. Dick was one of the founders of the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Cattle Association, our most active regional group. In addition to helping establish a Beltie Show at then-fledgling Wisconsin World Beef Expo, he and Pat spent many weeks each year tending booths and exhibiting animals at countless fairs and agricultural shows in the region.

Dick edited and published an excellent full-color tabloid promotional piece that served as an exhibit handout for some years, and also originated the Great Lakes group's website.

Dick's many friends were pleased that before he left us he was able to complete two projects dear to his heart -- construction of a state-of-the art barn and handling facility to replace the farm buildings destroyed by high winds several years ago; and more recently, with the help of family and friends, the loving restoration of his 1959 Corvette.

Rest easy, good friend, you will be sorely missed.

Dick was predeceased by son Chuck, but our sympathy is extended to his wife Pat, children Michael and Kathy, and nine grandchildren.

Society Sanctioned Show Rules

National Belted Galloway Show, Louisville, Kentucky Cattle in place noon November 16 until noon November 19, 2009

Junior Show 4:00 p.m. Tuesday, November 17, 2009

Open Show 3:00 p.m. Wednesday, November 18, 2009

(see rules for Grassfed Classes page 5)

1. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc.
2. Animals must be registered in U.S. Belted Galloway Society, Inc. Herd Book or recorded in the Appendix, or other Society recognized Herd Book. Animals must be properly marked, in good physical condition and typical of the breed in conformation. "Good physical condition" shall include but not be limited to the absence of any infectious condition such as ringworm or warts.
3. Original registration or recordation papers will be required at check in. Tattoos will be read by the show organizer.
4. To compete in the Junior Showmanship classes with an animal, the Exhibitor must be a Junior member of the Society and be 8 years of age or older. No bulls over 7 months of age may be used in Showmanship and any animal deemed unruly or dangerous while in the ring can be dismissed at the Judges discretion. Only one handler per animal will be allowed in the ring during Showmanship.
5. Substitution: should any entry be substituted for another no new fees are required. However, registration papers must be submitted with the request for substitution.
6. Animals will be able to set up at noon Monday, November 16th and may obtain a release any time between noon November 19th and 3 pm Friday, November 20th. All cattle and equipment must be out of the barn by 3pm Friday, November 20th.
7. Bulls over 12 months of age are required to wear nose rings and must have a lead attached to the ring whenever being lead.
8. Unattended animals must be double-tied with halter rope plus neck rope or two halters, two ropes.
9. Classes: The Show Committee reserves the right to split over-enrolled classes, or to combine under-enrolled classes, as they see fit.
10. Exhibitors are responsible for making sure entries are in the staging area before their classes are called. Exhibitors that do not enter the show ring within 3 minutes of the announcer's final call, forfeit the right to compete in that class.
11. The Show Committee reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include any injections of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter conformation; any additions of artificial tailheads or polls; any surgical alteration of the animal's shape; as well as any dyeing or coloring which alters the animal's natural color pattern. Artificially filling animals internally (pumping) is strictly prohibited.
12. Decisions of the judges are final except where mistake, fraud or misrepresentation is proven. Complaints, if any, must be tendered in writing to the Show Committee. Costs of any resultant investigations shall be borne by the complainant if allegations are dismissed, or by exhibitor against whom the complaint was issued, if allegations are proven correct.
13. Interference with or disrespect shown to the judge by any exhibitor during the performance of the judge's duties shall be deemed grounds for immediate disqualification.
14. All bulls must have two descended testicles to show. No cryptorchids will be allowed.
15. All animals will be required to be weighed, measured and ultrasounded. No exceptions.
16. Exhibitors must obey all rules of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc. and of the North American Livestock Exposition or be disqualified.

during the NAILE in Louisville, KY November 16-19, 2009 is inserted in this newsletter. The open and junior shows will again be held in Broadbent Arena, but we will hold the sale in New Market Hall. It is within easy walking distance from Broadbent. Our auctioneer will be Thomas Carper who is familiar with our breed and has conducted other Belted Galloway sales. We are in the process of negotiating with EDJECast so that the sale can be viewed via live web casting. I will update the membership in my message next month.

New to the National Show is the addition of two grassfed classes (Cow/calf pair and Finished Steer). Remember that we must have five farms that are willing to participate to hold these classes. All of the following criteria must be met in order to qualify for these classes:

1. All animals shown must come from a 100% grassfed farm.
2. Animals shown must be second generation to the exhibitor farm. (This means animals must be born on the 100% grassfed farm. They cannot be purchased and then grassfed.)
3. The only supplementation of grass is hay or hay silage. (Absolutely no grain or corn).
4. No growth hormones may be administered.

You will find your entry forms for that show in this newsletter. (Please check the grassfed box at the top of the entry form so that the Office will know that you are 100% grassfed.)

In closing I would like to encourage everyone to keep Pat Frey (WI) in their prayers, as we received word of Dick's passing. Dick was very instrumental in the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association for many years. He served as president, vice president and director of GLBGA.

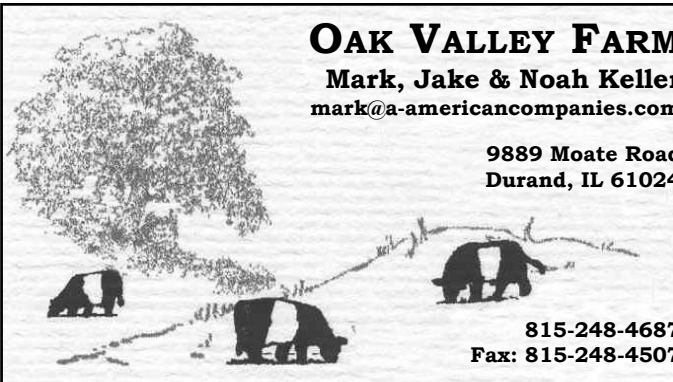

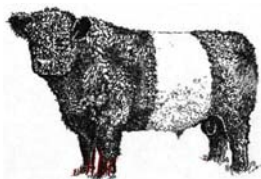
