The Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association and Wisconsin River Meats hosted a terrific, educational weekend for the Belted Galloway Society's Annual General Meeting in South Central Wisconsin. The event held October 15-17 was attended by Beltie enthusiasts.

Guests attended a fun, meet and greet party at the Ho-Chunk Hotel in Baraboo, WI on Friday evening. Bright and early Saturday morning, Society President Ron Howard and GLBGA President Terry Willis welcomed all to the morning conference. Guest speakers were: Ron Black (CAN) Canadian Livestock Records Corporation; Rachel Fogle (IL) Area 5 Beltie Youth Group; Craig Saxe (WI) University of Wisconsin-Extension. Mr. Black gave an overview of CLRC registry service, website, membership info, and animal identification. Miss Fogle explained the origins of the Beltie Youth Group, Area 5 BYG activities, and presented The Harry T. Burn Award to Kathi Jurkowski of Rockton, IL. Saxe covered the basics of rotational grazing, understanding plant growth, how to set up grazing systems, fencing alternatives, watering and frost seeding.

The afternoon session began with two bus loads of folks experiencing an adventurous, round-about, bus ride to John & Diane Hamm's Wisconsin River Farm. Six Belted Galloway steers were entered in The High Steaks Carcass Contest. Keith Vandervelde of University of Wisconsin judged the carcasses. Wisconsin River Meats won the competition (see table page 5) and Michelle Ogle (NJ) had a perfect score in the meat judging contest. Special thanks to John Hamm for providing fresh ears for Dr. Vic Eggleston's tattooing demonstration. Dr. Eggleston demonstrated the proper technique and guests were able to try their new skills out under his skillful instruction.

Guests returned to the Ho-Chunk Conference Center for an evening banquet and silent auction to benefit the Belted Galloway Foundation, Inc. During the banquet, \$1,346 was raised to benefit The Foundation.

The Annual General Meeting followed on Sunday, October 17. President Howard was unable to attend and Past President Mark Keller read his message.

Education and fellowship are the two key ingredients for a successful Annual General Meeting and I commend you all for achieving both so successfully. On a related note, I want to commend the Great Lakes group for all they do. They have clearly set the standard for every regional group in this country to look up to.

The first 9 ½ months of my term have certainly been exciting and enjoyable. The work and encouragement that Council, support people and members have exhibited has been great. With the transition from Laura Glassmann, I can't thank Vic Eggleston enough for stepping forward, as this transition would not have been nearly as smooth without his background, experience, and great relationships with us all.

Secondly, it was a significant leap to put our faith in the folks at CLRC to manage all of our registries and data. Background checks I did and feedback from people in the United States and Canada all indicated that they were far and away the best option for our members now and for the future. I am so pleased to report, that "leap" we took is proving to have been in the right direction. Increased support and services provided, including the pedigrees on the web, are only the beginning. We look forward to growing our relationship with CLRC

We have also undertaken to include even more Beltie members in the various committees that have been established. I doubt there has ever been a time in our breeds' history where the breadth of knowledge and skills needed to best serve our members has ever been higher. The steady growth of our membership across the country is great, but because of that growth we have members with a wider variety of needs and we need to be able to understand them and react.

A good example of reacting to our times was the

creation of our first Legal Review Committee. Doing things right from the beginning, as opposed to reacting to problems, is important for members and Council and I thank Sherry Abney (IN) and George Adams (TX) for being our first committee members.

Similarly, the need to provide us with the best knowledge and controls has led us to ask your consideration to create positions for Secretary and Treasurer separate from our Executive Director position. The By-law changes will allow us to even further seek partners to help advise, guide and lead us in the best directions.

Am I happy with the first 9 months? For those of you who know me, I always think there is more that I could do or more that I could have gotten accomplished. But it is a good start thanks to the help of so many.

This next year, I would hope to expand and involve all committee members to an even greater extent. I would hope to create systems whereby member feedback and needs can be increasingly heard, whether that be through direct communication or new electronic options.

Council has organized and developed some great marketing efforts over this last year, including a plan we have that could result in over 5000 people interested in registering for a heifer to be given away. For every one of those people, we will have an e-mail address and we will reach out to them and further market our breed and breeders. But are our members ready to best position their cattle and market them themselves? Do they have the tools, resources and skills they need? Can we learn from some members what has worked for them and share those ideas with everyone? We will consider putting efforts into helping members not only with national marketing but local and on farm options as well.

Long term, we need to look at our breed's needs, challenges and opportunities ... years into the future. The number of "mini-Belties" being developed and raised is growing all the time. Some breeds have embraced this market and even established separate registries for that variety of their cattle which allowed them to not only

control it, but enjoy the benefits of the revenue the registries created. Other breed associations have ignored it, and people have broken off and set up their own associations. Which do we want to do? I don't know, but we will talk about it in 2011 and work towards making a decision that is best for our members.

What will our Society and its services look like 5 or 10 years from now? I am not sure, but I do like our Council's willingness to look into the future and not just react to today's issues. I look forward to the next 14 months of my term and working with you all.

Elections were held and returning to Council serving a 2-year term is Jerry Moore (KY) and Jon Rozelle (AZ). Newly elected to serve a 2-year term were: Scott Griffith (TX).

The Spring Meeting will be held during the National Belted Galloway Sale, Fryeburg, ME in April 2011. The Annual General Meeting will be hosted by Little Everglades Ranch, Dade City, FL in October 2011.

## Fall Council Meeting

The Fall Council Meeting was called to order on 1 p.m. Friday, October 15, 2010 in Barbaoo, WI by President Ron Howard. Council members present John Bednarski (KY), Leanne Fogle (IL), Mark Keller (IL), Jerry Moore (KY), Kris von Dohrman (NH), and Secretary/Treasurer Victor Eggleston (WI). Leanne Fogle also represented the Newsletter office. Absent: Michael Caldwell (WI), Loren Olson (IA), Jon Rozelle (AZ).

Introductions of Council and all those in attendance were made. The minutes of the July 2010 teleconference were approved. Society Secretary Victor Eggleston provided Society membership and registration data as follows: Regular: 577; Junior: 97; Associate: 22; Life: 106. The following 2010 registration transactions were reported: Male: 124; Steers: 12; Purebred Female: 604; Appendix: 89; Transfers: 645. The Society has experienced 347 total inquiries to-date.

Treasurer Vic Eggleston presented the Treasurer's report in detail in comparison with the 2009 report. The Belted Galloway Society, Inc. balance sheet shows a to-date profit of \$11,003. Society funds in checking \$ 12,840. Society funds in savings \$45,100. Eggleston further reported The Belted Galloway Foundation has total funds of \$73,720.

**Promotion and Advertising.** Chairman John Bednarski reported that the committee ran two ads in *Grit* publications: *Mother Earth News* and *Farmer's Almanac*. Costs totaled approximately \$300. Ads appear every-other-month with circulations around 2000. The Belted Galloway Heifer Give-Away contest will aid the Society in creating a database. Bednarski attended the *Mother Earth News* Fair to spark interest in the contest. The October/November issue of *Grit* will introduce the first ad for the heifer drawing. Currently, there are 980 online registrants for The Belted Galloway Heifer Give-Away and the magazine promotion is not in print. Respondents will give name, address, email, and phone number. Sweepstakes are being managed by *Grit* publications and their legal counsel. Mr. Bednarski is predicting the possibility of 5000 leads when the magazine goes to print. Broadcast emails will be the response to interested parties. Mr. Bednarski requested carry-over of the advertising budget and increasing the budget in 2011 to include the printing of nutritional inserts. Mr. Bednarski suggested Council hire a photographer to aid in promotions.

**Budget.** Chairman Mark Keller presented the 2011 BGS Budget. Mr. Keller requested that the 2010 Shows and Sales expenses be tracked and reported in more detail. To-date the Society shows a balance sheet profit.

**Fundraising.** President Howard stated the committee is studying the possibility of jointly developing a Dick

Anderson Memorial Scholarship between The Belted Galloway Foundation Inc. and The Belted Galloway Society Inc. Possibilities include a combination of photo submissions and ad/marketing campaign plans.

**Beltie Youth Group.** Chair Leanne Fogle reminded Council that the Beltie Youth Group is divided into six regions across the country. A total of 45 youth members participated in 3 events from August through October in Area 1. A silent auction and a quilt raffle have been held to support programs in Area 1. Area 2 has been split between Area 1 and Area 5 leaders. In Area 3 Belties were exhibited at the South Carolina Junior Beef Round-up. Area 4 has requested materials from the Society office to promote the breed to prospective youth in that region. In Area 5 a total of 33 youth members participated in 3 events from July through September. Area 5 is holding a photo contest to raise funds during the AGM. Area 6 is expansive with limited youth populations. Three members of the BYG were accepted into the BYG semen project.

**Grievance.** Chairman Mark Keller reported there has been no activity.

**Long Range Planning.** Chairman Victor Eggleston reported studies are ongoing related to closing the Herd Book. The Legal Committee finalized the By-law language to reflect adding the position of Executive Director.

**Society Sales.** Chairman Jerry Moore reported there are fifteen live lots plus semen and embryos consigned to The 2010 Belted Galloway Premium Sale to be held in Louisville, KY.

**Society Shows.** Chairman Jerry Moore stated show entries are coming in for the National Show in Louisville, KY. Moore will study soliciting regional shows and ask for the ability to assign regional show titles.

**Beef Technology and Research.** President Ron Howard reported there has been no activity.

**Communication, Education, & Information Technology** President Howard stated the committee has suggested updates for the website [www.beltie.org](http://www.beltie.org). Other suggestions included linking the CLRC homepage with [www.beltie.org](http://www.beltie.org) as well as studying the possibility of linking to *Grit*. Regarding other electronic media such as Facebook and Twitter, there is a fair amount of interest for a Beltie forum, but the concern is how to monitor content using social media. The University of Maine has offered the Belted Galloway Society Inc., the technology to use webinars. Readers like seeing faces of Council in the newsletter.

**Chatfield Scholarship.** Chair Kris von Dohrman said the committee was pleased to award 3 scholarships in 2010.

Von Dohrmann stated that the committee is studying a better point system to grade applications. Award amounts of scholarships are low and the committee will study the possibility of increasing the dollar amount. Also the committee will determine how many times a scholarship may be awarded. More creative scholarships are encouraged.

**Breed Performance** President Ron Howard stated the tools are in place for our membership to do performance reporting. The CLRC provides a reporting service with informational boxes on the registration application form such as hip height, frame scores and weights. The committee will study how to collect the information and how the information will be useful to the membership.

**Legal Committee.** President Ron Howard informed Council the committee worked to make By-law changes to include an Executive Director position. After discussion, it was determined that some changes need to be made before the membership may vote on the By-law change. A motion will be made during the Annual General Meeting to clarify language and numbering issues.

**Nominating Committee Report.** Chairman Mark Keller reported that following officers were recommended for the year 2010: President Ron Howard (ME), Vice President John Bednarski (KY), Secretary/Treasurer, Victor Eggleston (WI). Council accepted the nominations. Keller reviewed the current positions open for Council members and communicated the Nominating Committee recommendation for Scott Griffith (TX), Jerry Moore (KY), Jon Rozelle (AZ), to serve a two-year-term.

**New Business.** Maximum letters when registering an animal will expand from 25 letters to 35.

**Annual Magazine.** Dr. Eggleston announced that web editor, Eric Butler, has agreed to do the annual magazine.

**Annual General Meeting.** The 2011 Annual General Meeting will be hosted by Bob & Sharon Blanchard, Little Everglades Ranch, Dade City FL.

## Harry T. Burn Award

Sue Drew, Awendaw, South Carolina wrote to the Belted Galloway Society and nominated Kathleen Jurkowski of Rockton, IL for outstanding support and promotion of the Belted Galloway breed. Council unanimously agreed. Beltie Youth Group member Rachel Fogle (IL) presented the award to Mrs. Jurkowski during the Annual General Meeting.

This award was established and funded in 1984 by his widow in memory of the late Harry T. Burn, Tennessee, one of the Society's early dedicated breeders. His nephew, James E. Burn, was President of the Society when he announced that the award, a large perpetual trophy and an engraved individual plaque, would be given to persons singled out as having provided outstanding support and promotion to the Belted Galloway breed. The award is not annual, rather, it is presented from time to time as merited.

Kathleen Jurkowski of Rockton, IL has worked tirelessly since the early 1990's to promote youth programs and Belted Galloway cattle. She was the national leader for the Beltie Youth Group for many years. Every year, BYG members show at the Kathi Jurkowski National Junior Show in Louisville, KY. She chaired a committee that developed a selection guide for purchasing Belted Galloway cattle. In 2008, Kathi's dream of creating *The Beltie Youth Group Handbook* came to a reality. Kathi serves as the Public Relations Director of the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association. Kathi and Jerry Jurkowski's Klover Korner Farm has been featured in many print publications.

Kathi is quoted, "My hope is that I will make a difference in the lives of Beltie Youth Group members because they in turn have made a difference in mine."

Kathi wrote, "I could not have done any of what I did, if it wasn't for good Beltie friends! I am the idea person and I needed help along the way. For those that have ever helped me, and you know who you are, I thank you for your support and your friendship. After all, we all do it for the love of the breed and junior members!"
