2 Divisions --- Grain Fed and Grass Fed

1. \$25.00 per head, maximum of 25 steers, based on the date of the paid entry fee.
2. Only *purebred*, Belted Galloway steers will be accepted. Registration papers are required.
3. Steers must not be over 30 months of age!
4. Steers must be tattooed and tagged before they arrive for slaughter.
5. Steers must have a minimum weight 850lbs.
6. No implants or steroids can be used on any steers
7. Steers do not have to be halter broke but must have a manageable disposition.
8. Champions must grade Select, Choice or Prime on the rail.
9. Cattle must be checked in: Monday, June 4, 2019, 8:00 a.m. to 5 p.m. or Tuesday, June 5, 2019 7:00 a.m. to 9 a.m. unless arrangements are made prior with John Hamm.
10. Steers must be owned by Jan. 1, 2019.
11. If grass fed steer is purchased, must be born on a grass fed farm.
12. Grass Fed must be fed accordingly to the USDA Grass Fed Standards.

Steers will be tagged and weighed on the Juneau County Livestock Committee Scales on arrival by WRB employees and or Great Lakes Volunteers.

Cattle will be slaughtered on Tues. June 5, 2019 and evaluated on Thurs. June 7, 2019.

Up to 10 steers may be purchased by Wisconsin River Meats. They will purchase only grain fed steers and they must grade select, choice or prime. They will pay regular producer price, \$\$\$ per hot hanging weight, whatever market is at that time.

If your carcass is *not* one of the ones bought by WRM then it will remain the property of you, the exhibitor. The carcass can be picked up after the contest or cut & wrap instructions can be left at WRM. Processing fee is to be paid by you the carcass exhibitor/owner.

USDA Grass Fed Standards

Claim: This claim applies that this steer's diet through his life span, with the exception of milk consumed prior to weaning, is solely derived from forage, which for the purpose of this claim is any edible herbaceous plant material, that can be grazed or harvested for feeding, with the exception of grain. Foraged based diets can be derived from (grass (annual or perennial) forbs, (e.g. legumes, Brassica and browse (leaves of wood plants such as scrubs). However, crops normally harvested for grain (including but not limited to corn, soybean, rice, wheat or oats) are only eligible feed if they are forage or harvested in the vegetative state, *pre-grain*. Animals can not be fed grain or grain by products and must have continuous access to pasture during growing season. Hay, haylage, baleage, silage, crop residue without grain and other roughage sources may also be fed and are acceptable. Consumption of seeds naturally attached to forage is acceptable. Cattle can only be fed other feeds at a rate of 1% of their total feed (not animal weight). This does not include mineral/salt.
